We are staying busy here in the Science classroom in middle school. It is hard to believe that it is the end of the year and how much we have accomplished!

In **5<sup>th</sup> grade** we have been learning about the solar system. This includes the planets, the lunar cycle, and we will be touching on constellations. The students have loved doing projects about the planets and learning more about what makes up our solar system.

In **6<sup>th</sup> grade** we finished up the curriculum earlier than planned, so we have been doing more review on what we have learned and made our own classroom science fair. The students had a great time in their groups experimenting and working through the projects.

In **7<sup>th</sup> grade** we have finished up the human body! They ended the long unit with building a human body model out of paper. They had all of the major organs, muscles, and bones to place in the right location on the outline of their body!


In **8<sup>th</sup> grade** we are currently discussing different parts of environmental science: pollution, deforestation, and how humans impact the environment as a whole.
